4	Abode (/əˈbəʊd/)	House or home
5	Abstract (/æbˈstrækt/)	Existing as an idea rather than having a physical or practical existence
6	Accent (/ˈæk.sent/)	Individual, local or national way of speaking
7	Accommodate (/əˈkɒmədeɪt/)	Provide somebody with a place to live
8	Acknowledge (/əkˈnɒlɪdʒd/)	Accept that something is true
9	Adhere (/ədˈhɪə(r)/)	Stick firmly to something
10	Autonomous (/ɔːˈtɒnəməs/)	(of a country, region, etc.) Able to govern itself
11	Beige (/beɪʒ/)	Very light yellowish-brown colour
12	Belief (/bɪˈliːf/)	Feeling that somebody or something is real and can be trusted
13	Benefactor (/ˈbenefagˈtɔːr/)	A person who gives money or help to an organization such as a charity or school
