- 7. approximately/əˈprɒksɪmətli/used to show that something is almost, but not completely, accurate or correct
- 8. architecture/'a:kitektsə(r)/the art and study of designing buildings
- 9. articulation/a: tɪkjʊˈleɪʃn/the formation of clear and distinct sounds in speech
- 10. auditorium/,ɔ:dɪ'tɔ:rɪəm/the part of a theatre, concert hall, or other public building in which the audience sits
- 11. baccalaureate/ bakə lə:rrət/an examination intended to qualify successful candidates for higher education
- 12. barbecue/'ba:bikju:/a meal or gathering at which meat, fish, or other food is cooked out of doors on a rack over an open fire or on a special appliance
- 13. bibliography/ bibli pgrəfi/a list of the books referred to in a scholarly work, typically printed as an appendix
- 14. biodegradable/ˌbʌɪə(ʊ)dɪˈgreɪdəbl/ (of a substance or object) capable of being decomposed by bacteria or other living organisms and thereby avoiding pollution
- 15. bronchitis/bron kaitis/inflammation of the mucous membrane in the bronchial tubes. It typically causes bronchospasm and coughing
- 16. bureaucracy/bjo'rɒkrəsi/a system of government in which most of the important decisions are taken by state officials rather than by elected representatives
- 17. callisthenics/ kalıs θεniks/gymnastic exercises to achieve bodily fitness and grace of movement
- 18. camaraderie/ˌkaməˈrɑːd(ə)ri/mutual trust and friendship among people who spend a lot of time together
- 19. ceremonial/ serr mooniel/relating to or used for formal religious or public events
- 20. chameleon/kəˈmiːlɪən/a small slow_moving Old-World lizard with a prehensile tail, long extensible tongue, protruding eyes that rotate independently, and a highly developed ability to change colour
- 21. chandelier/ ʃandəˈlɪə/a large, decorative hanging light with branches for several light bulbs or candles
- 22. choreography/ kpri pgrəfi/the sequence of steps and movements in dance or figure skating, especially in a ballet or other staged dance
- 23. circumference/səˈkʌmf(ə)rəns/the enclosing boundary of a curved geometric figure, especially a circle

- 30. documentation/dokjom(ε)n'tei \int n/material that provides official information or evidence or that serves as a record
- 31. dogmatism/'dogmatiz(ə)m/the tendency to lay down principles as undeniably true, without consideration of evidence or the opinions of others
- 32. dysmorphia/dis'mo:fiə/deformity or abnormality in the shape or size of a specified part of the body
- 33. ecclesiastical/i_kli:zi'astikl/relating to the Christian Church or its clergy
- 34. egalitarian/r galr terran/believing in or based on the principle that all people are equal and deserve equal rights and opportunities
- 35. emancipation/i mansi peisn/the fact or process of being set free from legal, social, or political restrictions; liberation
- 36. embarrassment/im'barəsm(ə)nt/a feeling of self-consciousness, shame, or awkwardness
- 37. enthusiastic/in θju:zi'astik/having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval
- 38. epidemiology/ˌɛpɪdiːmɪ'plədʒi/the branch of medicine which deals with the incidence, distribution, and possible control of diseases and other factors relating to health
- 39. ethnography/εθ'nografi/the scientific description of people's cultures with their customs, habits, and mutual differences
- 40. euphoria/ju: 'fɔ:rɪə/a feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness
- 41. evangelical/i:van'dʒɛlɪkl/of or according to the teaching of the gospel or the Christian religion
- 42. exaggeration/ig_zadʒəˈreɪʃn/a statement that represents something as better or worse than it really is

- 48. franchise/ˈfran(t)ʃʌɪz/an authorization granted by a government or company to an individual or group enabling them to carry out specified commercial activities, for example acting as an agent for a company's products
- 49. fundamentalism/ˌfʌndəˈmɛntəlɪz(ə)m/a form of a religion, especially Islam or Protestant Christianity, that upholds belief in the strict, literal interpretation of scripture

- 51. geriatrician/dʒeriə trɪʃn/an expert in the branch of medicine or social science dealing with the health and care of old people

- 58. hegemony/hi'dzeməni/leadership or dominance, especially by one state or social group over others
- 59. hermaphrodite/həːˈmafrədʌɪt/an organism having both male and female sex organs or other sexual characteristics, either abnormally or (in the case of some organisms) as the natural condition
- 60. hippopotamus/ˌhɪpəˈpɒtəməs/a large thick-skinned semiaquatic African mammal, with massive jaws and large tusks
- 61. hooliganism/'hu:ligəniz(ə)m/violent or rowdy behaviour by young troublemakers, typically in a gang
- 62. humanitarian/hjv_mani te:rien/concerned with or seeking to promote human welfare
- 63. hypothetical/hʌɪpəˈθεtɪk(ə)l/based on or serving as a hypothesis
- 64. iconoclastic/AI kpnə klastık/criticizing or attacking cherished beliefs or institutions
- 65. idiosyncratic/ idiə(v)sıŋˈkratık/relating to idiosyncrasy; peculiar or individual
- 66. immunosuppressant/ imjunausa presnt/a drug that suppresses the immune response of an individual
- 67. individualistic/ indi vidgvə līstīk/more interested in individual people than in society as a whole
- 68. isolationism/ˌʌɪsəˈleɪʃənɪz(ə)m/a policy of remaining apart from the affairs or interests of other groups, especially the political affairs of other countries
- 69. jeopardize/'dʒɛpədʌɪz/put (someone or something) into a situation in which there is a danger of loss, harm, or failure
- 70. jingoistic/dʒɪŋgəʊˈɪstɪk/characterized by extreme patriotism, especially in the form of aggressive or war like foreign policy
- 71. jubilant/'dʒu:bɪlənt/feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph
- 72. jurisprudence/dʒvərɪs'pru:d(ə)ns/the theory or philosophy of law
- 73. juvenile/'dʒu:vɪnʌɪl/for or relating to young people
- 74. kaleidoscope/kəˈlʌɪdəskəop/a toy consisting of a tube containing mirrors and pieces of coloured glass or paper, whose reflections produce changing patterns when the tube is rotated
- 75. kinaesthetic/ˌkɪnɪsˈθεtɪk/relating to a person's awareness of the position and movement of the parts of the body by means of sensory organs (proprioceptors) in the muscles and joints
- 76. kleptomania/ˌkleptə(υ)'meɪnɪə/a recurrent urge to steal, typically without regard for need or profit
- 77. kryptonite/'krrptənʌɪt/ (in the fictional word of the cartoon, TV, and film character Superman) an alien mineral that has the property of depriving Superman of his powers
- 78. labyrinth/ˈlab(ə)rɪnθ/a complicated irregular network of passages or paths in which it is difficult to find one's way; a maze
- 79. lactobacillus/ˌlaktəʊbəˈsɪləs/a rod-shaped bacterium which produces lactic acid from the fermentation of carbohydrates
- 80. lexicographer/ leksi kpqrəfə/a person who compiles dictionaries
- 81. lieutenant/lef'tenent/an officer of middle rank in the army,navy, or air force
- 82. literature/'lit(ə)ritʃə/written works, especially those considered of superior or lasting artistic merit
- 83. lymphocyte/'limfə(v)sʌɪt/a form of small leucocyte (white blood cell) with a single round nucleus, occurring especially in the lymphatic system
- 84. magnanimous/mag'naniməs/generous or forgiving, especially towards a rival or less powerful person
- 85. mediocre/ mi:dr'əvkə/of only average quality; not very good
- 86. misanthropy/mɪˈsanθrəpi/a dislike of humankind
- 87. mitochondrion/ maitə(v) kondriən/an organelle found in large numbers in most cells, in which

- the biochemical processes of respiration and energy production occur. It has a double membrane, the inner part being folded inwards to form layers (cristae)
- 88. monophthong/'mpnə(f)θpη/a vowel sound that has a single perceived auditory quality
- 89. mythological/miθə lodʒikl/relating to, based on, or appearing in myths or mythology
- 90. narcissism/'na:sisiz(ə)m/excessive interest in or admiration of oneself and one's physical appearance
- 91. neurolinguistics/ˌnjʊərə(ʊ)lɪŋˈgwɪstɪks/the branch of linguistics dealing with the relationship between language and the structure and functioning of the brain
- 92. nomenclature/nə(σ) mɛŋklətʃə/the devising or choosing of names for things, especially in a science or other discipline
- 93. nutritionist/njo'trɪʃənɪst/a person who studies or is an expert in nutrition
- 94. obligation/pbli'geɪʃn/an act or course of action to which a person is morally or legally bound; a duty or commitment
- 95. ophthalmologist/ˌpfθalˈmplədʒɪst/a specialist in the branch of medicine concerned with the study and treatment of disorders and diseases of the eye
- 96. orchestra/ˈɔːkɪstrə/a group of instrumentalists, especially one combining string, woodwind, brass, and percussion sections and playing classical music
- 97. orthopaedic/, o:θo'pi:dɪk/relating to the branch of medicine dealing with the correction of deformities of bones or muscles
- 98. oxymoron/ pksi mo:ron/a figure of speech in which apparently contradictory terms appear in conjunction
- 99. pantomime/'pantəmʌɪm/a theatrical entertainment, mainly for children, which involves music, topical jokes, and slapstick comedy and is based on a fairy tale or nursery story, usually produced around Christmas
- 100. perpendicular/,pə:p(ə)n'dıkjulə/at an angle of 90° to a given line, plane, or surface or to the ground
- 101. phenomenal/fr'npminl/remarkable or exceptional, especially exceptionally good
- 102. philanthropist/fi lanθrəpist/a person who seeks to promote the welfare of others, especially by the generous donation of money to good causes
- 103. pneumonia/nju: ˈməʊnɪə/lung inflammation caused by bacterial or viral infection, in which the air sacs fill with pus and may become solid
- 104. pseudonym/'s(j)u:dənim/a fictitious name, especially one used by an author
- 105. quadrilateral/kwpdri lat(ə)rəl/a four-sided figure
- 106. quadruplet/'kwpdroplit/each of four children born at one birth
- 107. quarrelsome/'kwprəls(ə)m/given to or characterized by quarrelling
- 108. rationalization/ˌraʃənəlʌɪˈzeɪʃn/the action of attempting to explain or justify behaviour or an attitude with logical reasons, even if these are not appropriate
- 109. reconciliation/rek(ə)nsılı'eıſn/the restoration of friendly relations
- 110. resignation/rezig'neisn/an act of resigning from a job or office
- 111. rhetoric/'rɛtərɪk/the art of effective or persuasive speaking or writing, especially the exploitation of figures of speech and other compositional techniques
- 112. rhododendron/ˌrəʊdəˈdɛndr(ə)n/a shrub or small tree of the heather family, with large clusters of bell-shaped flowers and typically with large evergreen leaves, widely grown as an ornamental
- 113. romanticism/rə(v) mantısız(ə)m/a movement in the arts and literature that originated in the late 18th century, emphasizing inspiration, subjectivity, and the primacy of the individual

- 114. sarcophagus/sa: kpfəgəs/a stone coffin, typically adorned with a sculpture or inscription and associated with the ancient civilizations of Egypt, Rome, and Greece
- 115. schizophrenia/skɪtsə(ʊ) ˈfriːnɪə/a serious mental condition of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation
- 116. secretariat/ˌsɛkrɪˈtɛːrɪət/a permanent administrative office or department, especially a governmental one
- 117. secularism/'sɛkjʊlərɪz(ə)m/the principle of separation of the state from religious institutions
- 118. seismograph/'sʌɪzməgrɑːf/an instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration
- 119. spontaneous/spon'teiniəs/performed or occurring as a result of a sudden impulse or inclination and without premeditation or external stimulus
- 120. surveillance/sə'veɪləns/close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal
- 121. symposium/sim'pəvziəm/a conference or meeting to discuss a particular subject
- 122. taxonomy/tak'sɒnəmi/the branch of science concerned with classification, especially of organisms
- 123. terminology/ˌtəːmɪˈnɒlədʒi/the body of terms used with a particular technical application in a subject of study, profession, etc.
- 124. theatrical/θι'atrıkl/relating to acting, actors, or the theatre
- 125. tonsillitis/ tonsi lattis/inflammation of the tonsils
- 126. tyrannical/tr'ranrk(ə)l/exercising power in a cruel or arbitrary way
- 127. ultraviolet/ˌʌltrəˈvʌɪələt/ (of electromagnetic radiation) having a wavelength shorter than that of the violet end of the visible spectrum but longer than that of X-rays
- 128. upgradation/ˌʌpgrəˈdeɪʃ(ə)n/the action or process of raising something to a higher standard, grade, or rank
- 129. utilitarianism/jo tılı te:rıənız(ə)m/the doctrine that actions are right if they are useful or for the benefit of a majority
- 130. utopian/ju: 'təopiən/modelled on or aiming for a state in which everything is perfect; idealistic
- 131. valedictory/ vali dikt(ə)ri/serving as a farewell
- 132. ventriloquist/vɛnˈtrɪləkwist/a person, especially an entertainer, who can make their voice appear to come from somewhere else, typically a dummy of a person or animal
- 133. vivacious/vi'veisəs/attractively lively and animated (typically used of a woman)
- 134. vulnerable/'vʌln(ə)rəbl/exposed to the possibility of being attacked or harmed, either physically or emotionally
- 135. walkie-talkie/ wo:ki to:ki/a portable two-way radio
- 136. webliography/ webli agrəfi/a list of websites or electronic works about a particular subject that have been used by a person writing an article, etc.
- 137. xenophobia/ zenə fəubiə/dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries
- 138. xylophone/'zʌɪləfəʊn/a musical instrument played by striking a row of wooden bars of graduated length with one or more small wooden or plastic beaters
