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Academic audit process

- 1. Planning for academic audit (Jestha 2081): The meeting by IQAC began with a discussion on the planning phase of the academic audit. Initial preparations for the audit were made, including the formation of the academic audit evaluation team on the recommendation of CMC. The academic audit process was outlined, and the importance of establishing clear objectives and timelines for the audit was emphasized.
- **2. Data collection (Shrawan 2081):** Data collection for the audit was initiated. The audit team conducted classroom observations, interviewed faculty, staff, and students, and reviewed academic records. This phase was crucial in gathering the necessary information to evaluate the academic programs and overall quality at the college.
- **3. Report writing (Bhadra 2081):** The audit team began writing the draft report based on the collected data. The team summarized findings. The report aimed to provide a clear overview of the strengths and weaknesses identified during the audit.
- **4. Report sent to CMC and response received (Ashwin 2081):** The draft report was sent to the CMC for review. The CMC carefully reviewed the document and provided feedback and suggestions. Their response highlighted additional areas of concern and proposed revisions to improve the final report.
- **5. Final report completed (Kartik 2081):** The audit team incorporated the feedback from the CMC and finalized the report. The revised report addressed the concerns raised during the review phase and included specific recommendations for improvement in various academic areas.
- **6. Final report presented to CMC (Mangsir 2081):** The completed final academic audit report was formally presented to the CMC. The CMC acknowledged the findings and discussed the next steps for implementing the recommendations outlined in the report.

Executive summary

This academic audit of United College (UC) evaluates the institution's academic policies, practices, and outcomes, aiming to assess its strengths and identify areas for potential improvement. The audit covers various dimensions, including curriculum design and implementation, teaching-learning methods, student support systems, human resource management, and community engagement. Key strengths identified include the effective use of an interactive Educational Management Information System (EMIS), a variety of teaching materials and methods, a comprehensive range of student support services, and active alumni and community engagement. Additionally, the faculty's professional development initiatives and the college's commitment to a student-centered learning environment are highlighted as core assets.

Despite these strengths, the audit also identifies opportunities for growth, particularly in areas such as expanding research capabilities, enhancing faculty development programs, integrating more active learning strategies, and fostering stronger collaborations with external stakeholders. The audit also suggests the implementation of a continuous evaluation framework to assess teaching effectiveness, student learning outcomes, and curriculum relevance. The report concludes with a set of actionable recommendations that aim to improve faculty engagement, boost research output, and optimize student success, ensuring UC's position as a leading institution in higher education. By implementing these recommendations, UC can further enhance its academic offerings, strengthen its institutional reputation, and better serve its students and community.

Introduction

The college affiliated with Tribhuvan University runs Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS), Bachelor of Business Management (BBM), Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA), and Master of Business Studies (MBS) in an unrivalled environment. The college strives to equip students with the latest insight into the competitive world by making them more sensitive, sensible, and responsible. United College is not just a college in the literal sense, but rather a college in fact in that it embodies and uses all the necessary infrastructures both physical and academic to their fullest extent in order to enable the students to face all sorts of challenges and problems.

Facilities

For nourishment and social interaction, both students and staff have access to a cafeteria that serves a variety of meals and snacks throughout the day.

In terms of health services, the college is equipped with a sick room and offers first aid, outpatient services, and emergency care to address the medical needs of its students and staff. However, it is important to note that there are no inpatient facilities or ambulance services available on college, which may necessitate external arrangements for more serious medical situations.

Additional amenities on college include a well-stocked bookshop that provides essential academic resources and reading materials, as well as transport facilities to assist students in commuting to and from college. Printing services are also available, making it easier for students to manage their academic workload. The college ensures access to wholesome drinking water, which is vital for the health and well-being of all individuals on site. Moreover, an effective waste management system is in place to promote cleanliness and environmental sustainability.

However, it is worth mentioning that there are currently no banking services or ATMs available on college, which may require students and staff to plan accordingly for their financial needs while on site. Overall, the college is designed to create a supportive and enriching environment that fosters both academic success and personal growth.

Educational programs

United College (UC) offers a variety of educational programs at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels, all affiliated with Tribhuvan University (TU). At the bachelor's level, the college offers the Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA), Bachelor of Business Management (BBM), and Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS), all taught in English. The BCA program has a sanctioned intake of 35 students, with all spots filled in the 2080 academic year, while the BBM program had an intake of 44, admitting 25 students. The BBS program admitted 62 students. At the master's level, UC offers the Master of

Business Studies (MBS), which is also conducted in English, with 4 students admitted in the 2080 academic year. These programs are designed to equip students with specialized knowledge and skills to excel in their respective fields.

In the academic year 2080/81, United College provided substantial scholarship support across its various bachelor's programs, demonstrating a strong commitment to assisting students financially. The scholarships were distributed between full fee and partial fee types, with each program receiving varying amounts based on the number of students and the level of support required. The BBS program, across all years, received the highest total scholarship amounts. For example, BBS Year 2 had a total of NPR 962,500 in scholarships, benefiting 20 students. Similarly, BBS Year 1 and Year 4 students received significant scholarships, with total amounts of NPR 910,000 and NPR 580,000, respectively. The number of students receiving scholarships in BBS ranged from 5 to 20 students per year, reflecting the college's effort to support students throughout their academic journey.

The BBM program also saw considerable scholarship distributions, with the largest total scholarship amount of NPR 555,000 for Year 6 students, who were awarded support totaling NPR 555,000 for 13 students. Other BBM years such as Year 1, Year 3, and Year 4 had varying amounts between NPR 225,000 and NPR 350,000, supporting between 5 and 13 students. These scholarships demonstrate the institution's focus on providing financial assistance to students in different stages of their academic careers.

In the BCA program, scholarships were similarly spread across various years. The highest total for the BCA program was NPR 605,000, benefiting 10 students in Year 1. Other years, such as Year 3 and Year 4, received smaller scholarship amounts, ranging from NPR 130,000 to NPR 260,000, supporting a smaller number of students per year. This distribution highlights the college's balanced approach to providing aid across a variety of academic disciplines.

In terms of scholarship type, the full fee scholarships were generally given to fewer students, but the total amounts were larger. For instance, BBS Year 1 had 6 students

receiving NPR 570,000 in full fee scholarships. On the other hand, partial fee scholarships were awarded to a larger number of students, with amounts ranging from NPR 60,000 to NPR 637,500 per year. For example, BBS Year 2 had 15 students receiving NPR 637,500 in partial scholarships. This combination of full and partial fee scholarships allowed the college to support a wide range of students, ensuring that financial constraints did not hinder their educational aspirations.

Overall, United College awarded a total of NPR 7,685,000 in scholarships for the academic year 2080/81, benefiting 129 students across its bachelor's programs. This investment reflects the institution's dedication to making higher education more accessible to students, particularly those from marginalized or economically disadvantaged backgrounds. By offering both full and partial scholarships, the college is able to provide comprehensive support, enabling students to pursue their academic goals without the burden of tuition fees.

Students enrolled in the College during the current academic year

The student enrollment data at United College over the past four academic years highlights several trends in program popularity. The BCA program has seen a steady rise in enrollment, growing from 22 students in 2077 to 35 in 2080, reflecting increasing interest in IT and computer applications. In contrast, the BBM program has experienced fluctuating enrollment, peaking at 42 students in 2077 but declining to 25 in 2080,

possibly due to shifting student preferences. The BBS program saw a significant increase, with enrollment rising sharply from 13 students in 2077 to 62 in 2080, indicating growing demand for business studies. However, the MBS program experienced a noticeable decline, with enrollment dropping from 23 students in 2077 to just 4 in 2080, suggesting a shift away from postgraduate business studies in favor of other career options.

Academic information

United College operated with a total of 249 working days during the last academic year, which included both teaching and non-teaching days. Out of these, 154 days were dedicated to actual teaching, excluding examination periods. This provided students with ample instructional time to cover the curriculum. In terms of faculty and class sizes, the teacher-student ratios for the programs were 1:16 for the Management Faculty and 1:18 for the Computer Application Faculty. These ratios indicated that for every 16 students in the Management Faculty and every 18 students in the Computer Application Faculty, there was one instructor. Such ratios were considered optimal for providing individual attention and fostering a more interactive and personalized learning experience for students.

Alumni can serve as guest speakers in seminars, mentors for research projects, and provide career advice to students. An annual alumni meetup or conference would help foster stronger bonds between UC and its graduates.
- Create an Alumni database: An updated, comprehensive alumni database should be maintained to track their career paths, academic achievements, and involvement with UC. This data can be used to facilitate internships, job placements, and collaborative research opportunities for students.
- Alumni-student mentorship programs: UC could introduce formal mentorship programs where alumni guide current students, providing career advice, professional development, and networking opportunities. This would help students navigate their academic and professional lives with the support of experienced professionals.

6. Improving community engagement

Current situation: UC is in the process of developing a community engagement plan and collaborating with local communities. There is also room for improvement in involving external stakeholders in shaping curriculum and student learning.

Recommendation:

• Formalize community engagement strategy: UC should formalize its community engagement strategy, ensuring that both local communities are actively involved in the educational process. Collaborative projects, internships, and community-based learning initiatives can provide students with real-world experience while benefiting the community.

• Strengthen stakeholder feedback mechanisms: UC should regularly seek feedback from its stakeholders, including industry partners, alumni, and local community leaders, to ensure that the curriculum remains relevant and aligned with the needs of the job market. This feedback should inform the development of programs, especially in high-demand areas.

7. Evaluation and continuous improvement

Current Situation: UC has established many processes for academic evaluations and assessments but lacks a clear, ongoing mechanism for evaluating the effectiveness of its teaching methods and student outcomes.

Recommendation:

- Implement a comprehensive evaluation framework: UC should establish a formal framework for the continuous evaluation of teaching methods, student learning outcomes, and overall program effectiveness. This would include regular surveys, focus groups, and feedback sessions with students, faculty, and external stakeholders. Data collected should be used to inform improvements in teaching methods and the curriculum.
- Incorporate external reviews: UC can invite external experts and accreditation bodies to conduct regular reviews of its programs. This will provide an objective assessment of the college's academic quality and ensure compliance with international standards.

In summary, United College has made significant strides in creating an academic environment that promotes student success, faculty development, and community engagement. However, to continue on its path of excellence and growth, UC must focus on strengthening its research initiatives, faculty development programs, teaching-learning approaches, student support services, alumni engagement, and community involvement. By implementing these recommendations, UC will not only enhance the quality of its educational offerings but also ensure that its students are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and support they need to succeed in an increasingly globalized and competitive world.
