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Event Timeline HSMSS Reports



September 2022

Strategic Planning Workshop (4th and 5th September, 2022)

On September 4th and 5th, 2022, Hetauda School of Management and Social Sciences hosted a two-day Strategic Planning Workshop in collaboration with Antarpurana and K.G.S. Inc members Ms. Narayani Gaha, Ms. Monika Kadel, and Mr. Dilip Gurung. The workshop aimed to integrate Business Development Training and mentor students in developing their own business ideas. Day 1 focused on self-assessment, strategic planning, and development for Biz Creator's Lab, incorporating these into the teaching methodology. Day 2 involved planning and categorizing groups based on team dynamics and aligning prospective members' roles. This orientation laid the groundwork for a successful approach to the Business Incubation Club over the next five years.



Speech Competition (11th September, 2022)



On 11th September, 2022, the English department of the Science faculty at Hetauda School of Management and Social Sciences conducted a speech competition for class 12 students. November 2022

HSMSS Fest 2022 (11th Nov, 2022)



HSMSS FEST - 2022, centered around undergraduate level activities, was held within its premises. The event was organized with the aim of focusing on the overall development of undergraduate students. The inauguration of this program was conducted with the assistance of Vice Principal Ram Pandit Khanal, emphasizing the objective of fostering all-round student development. Various programs were included in this FEST - 2022, aiming to demonstrate how businesses and entrepreneurship can be integrated. Different stalls had been set up, showcasing items such as traditional snacks, handwoven textiles, books, and other merchandise for sale.

Hackathon (27th November, 2022)

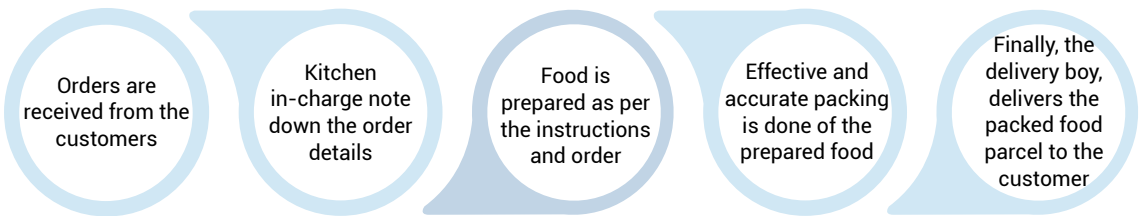



Minimizing Absenteeism: A Teacher's Experience of Working with Frequent Absent Students



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Context Setting

I've been working in the field of education for almost two and a half decades. My career as an educator began at a public school. However, later on, I was appointed lecturer at Hetauda School of Management and Social Sciences, Makawanpur, Nepal. Initially, I taught at the undergraduate level. The classes would be in the morning from six to ten, and there would be an average of 45 students in the classes. In the beginning, the students were regular in their classes and actively participated in academic activities; however, gradually, I found some of the students began to be irregular in their classes and rarely shared about the reasons for their frequent absence, which caused a colossal impact affecting almost all the sectors of teaching and learning. In addition, some of the students who were regulars also appeared approximately ten to fifteen minutes late in the classes. Such a trend among the students posed a question for my teaching career as well as for the future of the college. Thus, in this paper, based on my personal experience, I discuss specific causes for the absence and delay of students in the classes and provide some practical solutions to address the problems.

Introduction

The problems of absenteeism among students in the classes can be solved by the joint efforts of the school, family, and community by conducting several programs such as workshops, visiting students' families, managing awards for regular students, and providing parents with a contact person to have effective communication (Epstein & Sheldon, 2002). Focusing on the role of schools to minimize the problem of absenteeism, Chang and Romero (2008) argued that schools needed to have effective communication with the families of the absent students to understand the reasons for their absence and provide the importance of regularity in the class to promote effective learning. This reflected that absenteeism has adverse consequences as students miss out effective learning opportunities. In addition, Aurellana (2019) argued that a notable problem in the modern classroom is students' tendency to drop classes or arrive late in the classroom, which ultimately impacts their academic performance. Furthermore, Shahzada et al. (2011) suggest that a lack of relevant curriculum, teachers' insufficient incentives, and the attitudes of students and their families regarding education are some of the reasons for student

absenteeism. Moreover, Sanchez et al. (2015) claimed that chronic absences of students can be minimized by providing adequate teachers' time for them. By highlighting the impact of absenteeism, a study by Whitney and Liu (2017) claimed that the regular absence of students in classes increases the risk of students' involvement in unlawful activities and drug use. Moreover, Sarkodie et al. (2014) claimed that students' economic problems, illness, and distance to school were fundamental reasons for delay and absenteeism in the classes. This reflected that absenteeism and dallying in the classroom have a devastating impact on teaching and learning, and there can be multiple reasons that motivate students' absenteeism and delay in their respective classes.

The above scholarships indicated that absenteeism and delay in classes were significant barriers to students' academic success and provided some solutions to deal with the problems. Moreover, chronic absences may result from a variety of reasons, which include student or family health issues, parental job obligations, family duties, transportation issues, or a number of other circumstances. However, how teachers experience the problems of absenteeism and delay of students in the classroom and how they address such problems to promote the academic excellence of students would always have significant values. Therefore, to solve the problem of some students' irregularities and delays in the classroom, I attempted to find the real reasons for the absenteeism by developing friendly relationships with them. In the beginning, the majority of the irregular students made various excuses for their absenteeism and delay in their classes, such as family problems, mental health issues, illness, and transportation problems, just to name a few. However, gradually I overcame the obstacles and succeeded in reducing the absenteeism and tardiness. Therefore, in this brief reflective paper, based on my experience, I discuss some of the reasons for student absenteeism and how I minimized the rate of absenteeism in the classes to enhance better academic achievements.

Causes of Absenteeism and Delay in Class

I investigated some fundamental causes of absenteeism and delay of the students in their classes by keeping friendly relationships with them, visiting their families, and their other teachers. They were as follow:

1. Lack of Motivation

2. Lack of Family Support

I discovered some of the students were irregular in the classes due to a lack of family support for their education. They reported that they had stressful home lives because of conflict among family members. In addition, their parents did not pay attention to their education.

3. Lack of Proper Time

I found the majority of the irregular students had their own jobs, and they reported that due to their jobs, sometimes they would be overloaded and tired. In addition, they would have their trainings and meetings, which made them irregular in their classes.

4. Lack of Student-centric Learning Environment

Some of the absent students reported that they did not have passion for attending the regular classes as they did not enjoy the classroom teaching and learning activities, which were almost based on traditional ways of teaching without adopting the latest technologies and teaching methods.

Ways Forward for the Solutions

In this section, I discuss some ways forward to deal with the problem, such as motivating the students for regular classes, coping with the students' problems, and transforming the classroom teaching and learning environment, which I discuss below:

1. Motivating students

By establishing an inspiring environment, I minimized absenteeism. As a teacher, I presented the objectives for learning outcomes and emphasized the benefits of achieving them. I made an effort to clarify their wrong assumption that wealth is superior to education. I presented the examples of number of successful people together with their academic qualifications for this. I stated how their knowledge and talents helped them to succeed both financially and socially. They weren't politically connected or wealthy, yet they managed to succeed through their academic abilities. Their monetary concerns and materialistic assumptions were what made students seek jobs overseas. I presented numerous scenarios regarding family life. The extent to which, they will miss their relatives, the holidays, and their social bonds. When they ultimately return, they could feel isolated and lonely. I also advised them to consider going overseas once they had reached a certain degree of academic success. This managed to reduce absenteeism gradually.

2. Coping with Students' Problems

To address family-related issues I managed to get in touch with the family members directly. I presented complaints about their children and their disappointment. I asked them about the circumstances that created a stressful home situation and also about the explanations

for which they did not support their children. Additionally, I informed them of the negative effects their actions had on their children's health and learning. I conducted a joint meeting to establish an open environment for children and parents to communicate their feelings and expectations. They were misunderstood, and this helped me clear it up. Parents realized their mistakes and promised not to repeat such activities again. Students were also felt sorry for keeping their wrong perceptions towards parents. I also suggested the parents to have regular followed up in college so that remain Parents admitted that they made mistakes and promised not to repeat such activities again. Students felt guilty for carrying wrong perceptions about their parents. Additionally, I advised the parents to follow up with their children on a regular basis so they could keep in touch with the institution and be aware of how well they were doing. in touch with.

3. Transforming Teaching and Learning Environment

To make a classroom innovative, interactive, and interesting, I tried and shifted the traditional classroom to the flipped classroom. This strategy keeps student learning at the center of teaching. For effective application of this strategy, I provided the educational materials in advance for students to study at home and then made them work in the classroom. I also suggested that they watch videos related to the course content.

On applying this strategy, I realized students were more responsive, and actively participated in their learning through interaction with me and their peers. They were receiving and providing valuable & meaningful inputs. The use of this strategy gradually reduced student absence, and there was also a noticeable improvement in their academic results.

Conclusion

In this article, I discuss some of the causes contributing to tardiness and absenteeism in a classroom and provide some practical solutions to minimize the problem. I adopted the strategies of motivating them, coping with their possible problems, and transforming the classroom environment by utilizing the latest technologies and teaching methods. These procedures not only lower the rate of absence and delay among students but also promote the teaching and learning environment in the classroom. In this concise reflection, I concentrate on the actions that I carried out to reduce absenteeism and tardiness among students.

Existentialism: An Inquiry on the Meaning of Life



This is a dangerous path for a person to undertake because it leads us to only two ultimate conclusions: suicide or depressive indifference. From an existentialist point of view, nihilism is the worst possible conclusion for us to take and the most undesirable ending to the inquiry into the meaning of life. This view of existentialism cements it in stark opposition to and criticism of nihilistic beliefs. In this scenario, existentialism comes in to propose that there is no inherent meaning in life and that

one is to create it by himself. The meaning of life is in creating oneself rather than accepting the status quo and letting things go by on their own. We have to fight our own battles, and we have to face the challenges ourselves rather than letting things occur by themselves. Within an existentialist perception of the world, it is still devoid of any inherent meaning. The Sun and the Moon do not care about us; there is no meaning or reason for their existence. Yet, we, who can perceive and feel, can find our meanings relating to the world around us. It is in our hands that we struggle against the world to better ourselves and to better everyone around us. Existentialism, at its core, is centered around the concept of “amor fati,” which is Latin for “the love of fate.” What is before us and what is to occur to us can be controlled by us, and that is how we create meaning in life.

A good way to understand existentialism is in parallel with Buddhist ideals. A Buddhist believes that he will reincarnate over and over and over again, countless times. Each time, he is bound to suffer and find himself in pain due to his desires and temptations. It is only by rejecting those temptations and earthly desires that he truly finds peace. In a similar sense, existentialism posits that we also go through a similar process of reincarnation. Throughout our lives, we change and find ourselves metaphorically reincarnating as a new person. Each new experience and each new memory allow us to reincarnate over and over and over again, similar to the Buddhist. It is only through acceptance of change and the futility of resistance against change that an existentialist truly finds happiness and contentment. In addition, the existentialist finds meaning in the process of change and how he can change himself to be a better person. Each day, he is looking to live life as he finds fit and to reincarnate and develop himself anew. This way, existentialist ideas lead to a more positive outcome where one becomes a better man.

According to existentialism, existence precedes essence. It is through existing that a person

can shape themselves in coordination with their surroundings, rather than having an already preconceived form that is then defined to be the essence. Similarly, knowledge, according to existentialism, is not a concrete and unchanging fact but rather a subjective view of a topic. This idea is in stark contrast to rationalism, which is built on the philosophical premise that knowledge of a given subject can be objective and not a subject of individual experience. Similarly, existentialism postulates that humans are not rational beings and that they cannot make rational thoughts unclouded by any subjective experience. A man cannot make a decision independent of the things that he has experienced before him and is thus dictated by his experience, making him irrational. This is one of the core ideas of existentialism: that we are more driven by our personal feelings than logical and rational thought.

Similarly, morality is also handled equivalently, meaning that morality is not based on knowledge but on his judgment of right or wrong based on subjective experience. A man cannot make a moral choice without taking into account his thoughts of morality that are not predetermined or handed down by a higher power. This is also a major concept for the existential perception of free will in that we have free will, but that is largely dictated by our bearings. We are free to do what we want, but we cannot do everything that we want and are limited by various factors that are out of our control. It is only by embracing our free will and the ability to make moral decisions, be it from the sway of our own experience, that we can change ourselves for the better. This is the main reason why existentialism has found itself relevant within modern society, as the death and decay and lack of morality among men have torn the veneer of what religion set out to do. It is by abandoning religion, embracing our ability to control what we can, and finding meaning in what we ought to do that we can find satisfaction.

To conclude, existentialism is the answer to the most fundamental question of the meaning

behind life, that being that there isn't any inherent meaning; just the meaning that we choose to make ourselves through our actions. The main role of existentialism within modern societies is to fight against the plague of nihilism, which leads us down a dark path of depression and angst. We can find meaning and optimism amidst the indifferent universe. To do what we want to do is in our hands, and it is our own free will with which we dictate

our fate. By embracing change and the inability to attain the desire of constancy, we can truly find the meaning in life that we so seek and that we so live our lives. An existential man is an irrational mortal man; he is unable to live forever. Yet, he can live life to the fullest by embracing change and his fate. It is through that that he finds himself content, even when his mortality faces him. It is through the fear of death and pain that he truly lives a fulfilling life.

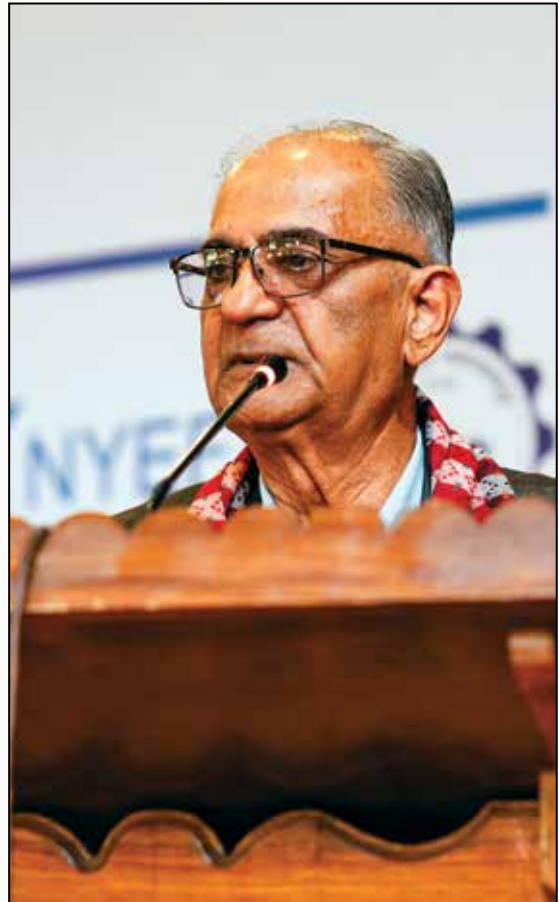

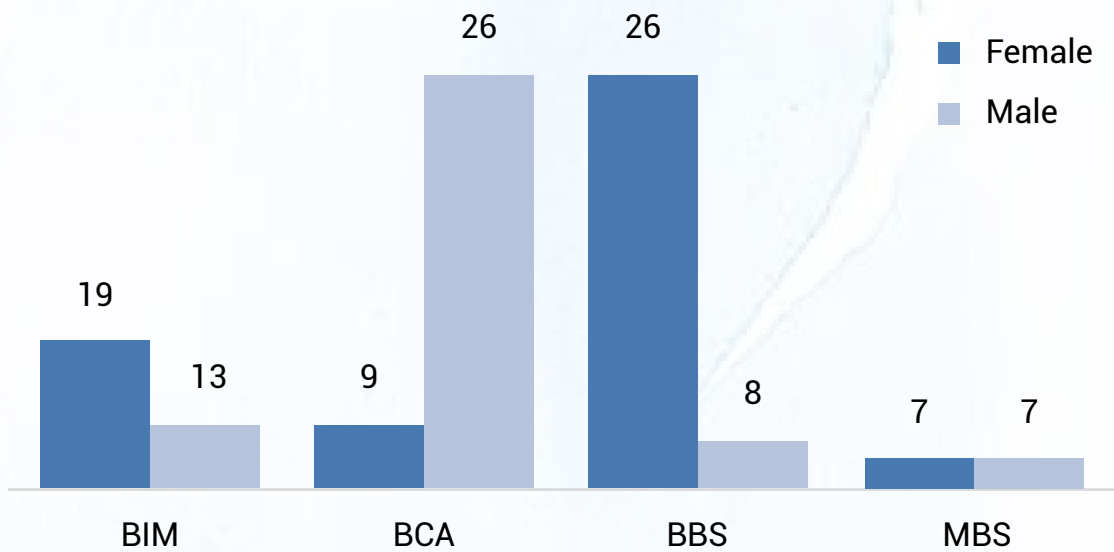

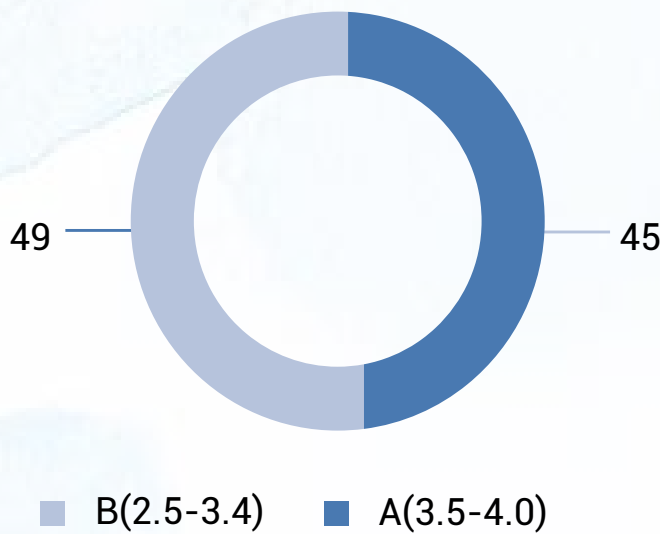


New Batch Enrollment Report

Total Number of Student 2023 Batch Enrolment

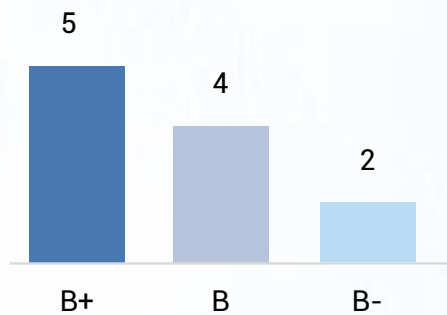


BIM Academic Performance 2022-23

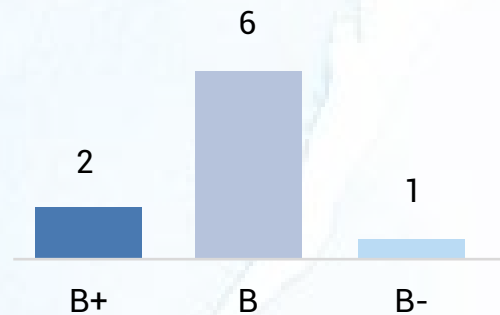


MBS Academic Performance 2022-23

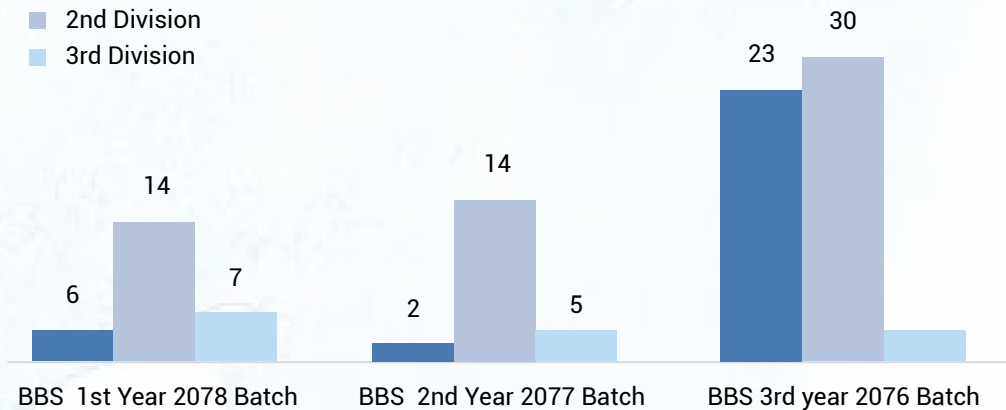

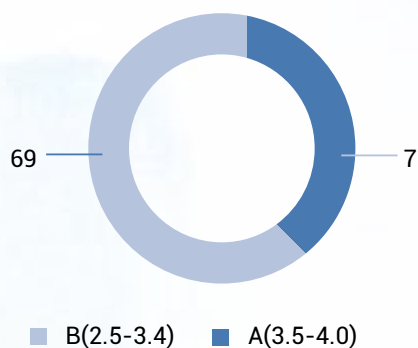
