This year the school major goals will revolve around the themes of curriculum improvement, professional development, and motivating teachers to do the best they can do for all students.

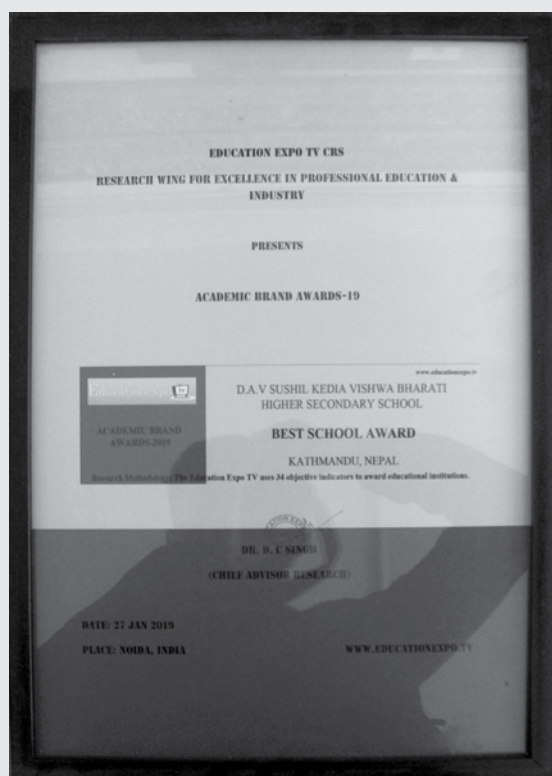
We as teachers are also determined to have a common goal to produce the very best, the smartest, well rounded students as we work independently within teams to raise the standard.

official Newsletter 'SANDESH' was released and distributed to the parents.

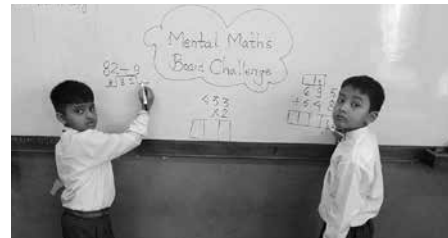
DAVSKVB School in collaboration with various publication houses and book distributors of Kathmandu had organized books exhibitions in the assembly ground.

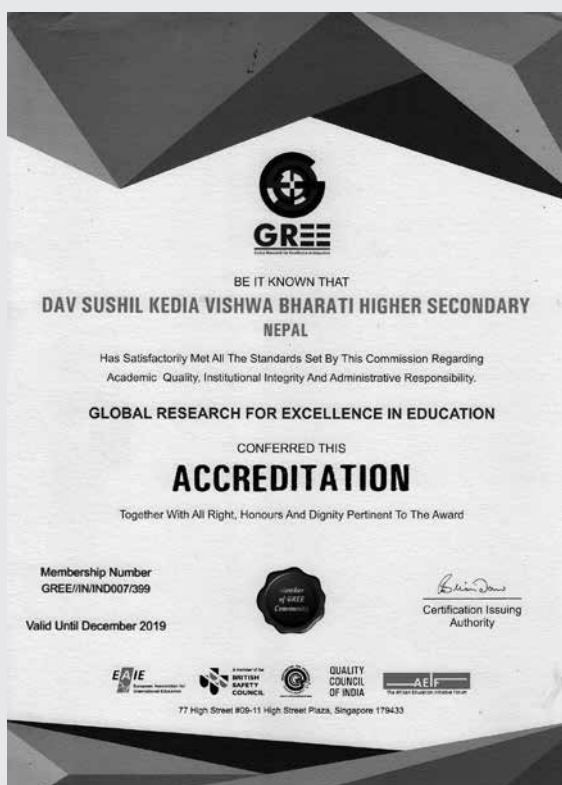

The students of Grade IX CBSE participated in HPE PowerPoint Presentation Competition in Jetavan Hall on

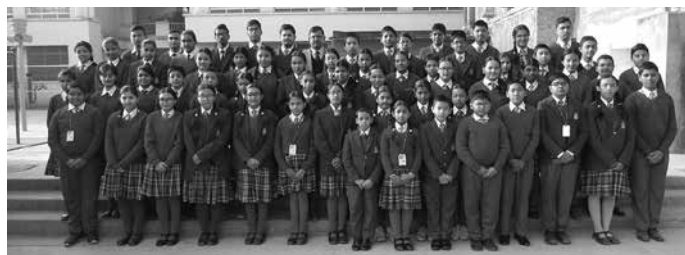
13<sup>th</sup> December, 2018. The objective of the programme was to motivate students in research and documentation, develop the spirit of teamwork and enhance presentation skills.

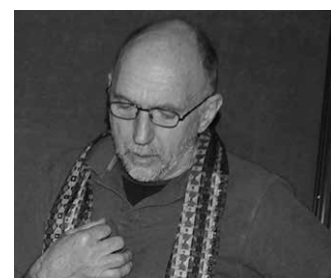
