As per the results published by National Examination Board, a total of 21 students from DAV scored A+ Grade and 56 scored A Grade in board results. A total of 170 students appeared in the SEE Board Examination and the result is 100% pass.

Aditya Mayank and Nitin Ranjitkar topped DAV school with 3.90 GPA. Four students- Arpan Pandey, Kristina Dangol, Shlesha Tamrakar and Utsav Bhurtel each scored 3.85 GPA for the second position. Similarly, three students- Namit Shah, Pawan Bhattarai and Upanayan Baskota each scored 3.75 for the third position.

The principal presented subject-wise results analysis and briefed a total of seventy seven students scored

Performance Index of the First Periodic Examination (Grade I to VIII) Announced in the Assembly

The report of performance index is based on the results of first periodic examination of the session 2022/23.

In fact, performance index is a section wise overall result analysis and the calculation is based on the number of section. (For example, if there are 6 sections in Grade I, the best performing section gets 60 points and the 10 points decreases simultaneously for the second, third and so on).

As per the results of grade I, section E with 60 points won the first position followed by section A with 50

points and section F with 40 points won the second and third position respectively.

Likewise, Section E of Grade II with 80 points won the first position followed by Section F and Section B in the second and third position respectively.

Similarly, section C of grade III with 70 points won the first position followed by section E and Section G in the second and third position respectively.

From grade IV, section A with 70 points won the first position followed by section E and section C in the second and third position respectively.

Moving to middle School, section A from grade V with 80 points won the first position followed by section B and section E in the second and third position respectively.

Likewise, section G from grade VI with 80 points won the first position followed by section A and section E in the second and third position respectively.

In the similar way, section F from grade VII with 70 points won the first position followed by section C and section D in the second and third position respectively.

the senior most artist of Nepal.

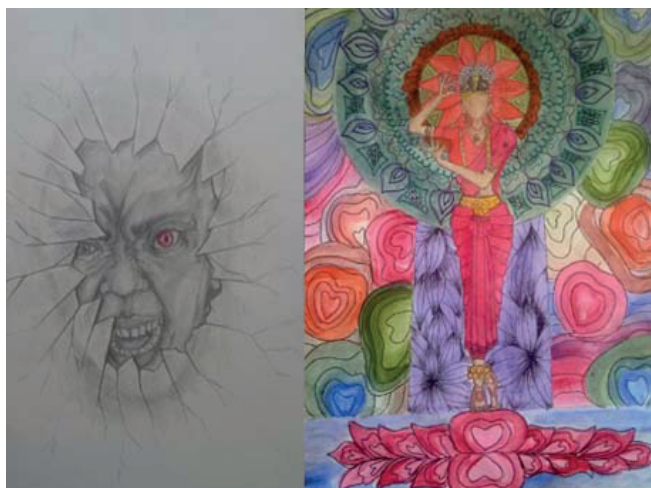
Sadhwi and Samyak won the second position in junior and senior categories respectively.
