




# A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

# 58<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Late Sushil Kedia Homage to Late Sushil Kedia with Sangha Daan and Dhamma Deshana



DAV Chairperson Shree Anil Kedia, along with his family, organized a 'Sangha Daan' and 'Dhamma Deshana' ceremony and paid homage to his brother at school premise on 5th October, 2024.

The 'Sangha Daan' and 'Dhamma Deshana' was organised to mark the celebration of 58th Anniversary of late Shree Sushil Kedia.

The event was graced by the benign presence of Honourable Bhikkhu Shilbhadra and Bhikkhu Nigrodha from Bishwoshanti Bihar, Baneshwor; Bhikkhu Bimalo from Siddhi Mangal Bihar, Harisiddhi, Lalitpur; and Bhikkhu Ananda from Munni Bihar, Bhaktapur. ## **Internal Teachers' Training**

The Human Resource Department, with the approval of the School Management, initiated a comprehensive internal Teachers' Training programme for the faculty of DAV School in December, 2024.

This initiative was designed to fulfill the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) requirement, which mandates that teachers complete 50 credit hours of professional training annually. Of these, 25 credit hours are dedicated to internal training, leveraging school's own resources. Faculty members are further encouraged to participate in online courses or workshops focusing on personal and professional development to meet the required hours. The remaining 25 credit hours are allocated for external training, facilitated by resource persons invited from outside the school.

#### **Internal Training Sessions**

The internal training sessions were conducted department-wise, as outlined by HR Manager, Mr. Aashish Rai. The training for December session, 2024 were as follows:

**7<sup>th</sup> December 2024:** Teachers from English, Nepali, Hindi, and Commerce departments attended a five-hour training session, held from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM. The Heads of Departments (HODs) facilitated the sessions, with Vice-Principal Mr. Ramchandra Khanal contributing as a resource person for Nepali department.



**14**<sup>th</sup> **December 2024:** Faculty from Science, Social Studies, Health and Population Environment, and Physical Education departments participated in a similar session. These sessions were also led by the respective HODs.

21st December 2024: Teachers from Mathematics, Computer Science, Vocational Studies, Foreign Language, Art and Craft, Music, and Dance departments completed their five-hour training session facilitated by the respective HODs.

The training sessions were designed to address key areas, such as innovative teaching methodologies, stress management for both educators and students, and tackling diverse pedagogical challenges. Furthermore, the sessions incorporated interactive discussions, enabling feedback collection to identify and bridge gaps, ultimately improving teaching practices.

#### **External Training Plan**

In addition to the internal programme, the school has scheduled external training sessions for January or February, 2025. These sessions will focus on school and career counseling, offering faculty valuable insights to further enhance their professional capabilities.

#### **Previous Initiatives**

In alignment with CBSE standards, the Principal Dr. Bhubaneswari Rao, had previously organised a series of workshops and training sessions from the beginning of the session. These sessions were tailored for teachers at various levels—Kindergarten, Junior School, Middle School, and Senior School—as well as for subject-specific groups and the entire teaching staff. These initiatives aimed to keep educators abreast of the latest teaching trends and methodologies required by the CBSE.

Similarly, the Education Department of Lalitpur Metropolitan City Office under the support of Ministry of Education had conducted additional teachers training sessions as mandated by the NEB.

Mathematics Week, held from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> March 2025, featured a series of mathematical competitions across Junior, Middle, and Senior School (Grades I to XI). The winners of various competitions were honoured for their achievements. In the Junior School, winners of the Run and Solve competition (Grade I), Bingo Game (Grade II), Card Game (Grade III), and Find Me-Board Game (Grade IV) were awarded gold, silver, and bronze medals along with certificates of achievement by Chief Guest Dr. Dhungana, in the presence of Vice Principal Mr. Ramchandra Khanal and Head of Mathematics Department, Mr. R.K. The event concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Senior School Mathematics Teacher Mr. C.B. Basnet. The MC for the programme was Middle School Mathematics Teacher Mr. Shyam Lal Das.

Before the exhibition, students were encouraged to use readily available materials from home. The competition was evaluated by Mr. Karn, along with senior school science teachers—Mr. Sudhir Singh, Mr. Vivek Chaudhary, Mr. Sanjay Kumar Shah, and Mr. Birendra Mandal.
