"GUIDING CHILDREN IN THE AGE OF AI: A SHARED JOURNEY OF PARENTS AND SCHOOLS"

Dear Parents, Guardians and Friends of DAVSKVB,

At the outset, I extend my heartfelt greetings to each one of you. I wish to sincerely thank you all for standing by the school in both good and challenging times. Your staunch support, trust, and constructive suggestions have been the true strength of DAVSKVB. With your continued partnership, I am confident that our school will scale newer heights, nurturing not only academic excellence but also the values and character that shape responsible global citizens.

As we close the first semester of 2025, I want to share a vision for learning that places curiosity, partnership, and thoughtful use of technology at the heart of every child's experience. The world our students are growing into is changing quickly: classrooms are blending in-person and digital learning, Al tools are entering everyday instruction, and educators worldwide are placing social-emotional learning, project-based experiences and personalized pathways at the centre of good practice. Our shared task — school and home together — is to make these changes serve deeper learning, creativity, and wellbeing rather than distracting from them.

Schools worldwide are increasingly embracing innovative practices to enhance learning. The use of AI and adaptive learning tools is growing rapidly, providing instant feedback, personalized practice, and reducing teachers' grading workload so they can focus on higherorder coaching, though guidance emphasizes ethical and age-appropriate use. At the same time, personalized and competency-driven pathways are being introduced, using datainformed diagnostics, micro-learning, mastery checkpoints to ensure students progress based on demonstrated understanding rather than seat-time. Instructional approaches are also shifting towards curiosity-centred and inquiry-based learning, with projectbased activities and design challenges placing students' questions and investigations at the heart of learning, thereby boosting motivation and transferable skills. Furthermore, stronger home-school partnerships and culturally-

responsive engagement are recognized as key to improving outcomes, with schools collaborating closely with families while respecting their cultures, languages, and contexts. Alongside these shifts, there is also a growing emphasis on Al literacy and digital citizenship, with global recommendations highlighting the importance of teaching students to critically evaluate, use, and create with Al while understanding data privacy, bias, and ethical implications.

These trends are opportunities. But they require careful choices and shared responsibility between teachers and parents.

So, how parents can help — practical strategies

Your role at home is powerful. Here are practical, research-backed ways you can support learning:

- Model curiosity, not just answers. When a child asks "why?", show how you would explore the question together — look up a fact, design a simple experiment, or ask what they think before searching. Small modeling of investigative behavior builds a lifelong habit.
- 2. Ask open questions and encourage thinking time. Use prompts like "How might we test

that?" or "What other possibilities are there?"
— and allow pauses. Children need time to form ideas.

- Partner on real projects. Encourage family projects (plant a small garden, plan a simple recycling drive, build a model) that integrate reading, maths and planning—this brings school skills into meaningful contexts.
- 4. Set routines that support focus. Regular reading time, a homework spot that's calm and well-lit, and predictable bedtimes improve attention and learning stamina. Evidence shows consistent parental involvement improves engagement even when the help is not content tutoring.
- 5. Learn with your child about AI and online safety. Be curious together about tools your child uses: ask what they ask an AI, how it decides, and what it might get wrong. Treat AI as a collaborator to be checked, not an unquestioned authority.
- Celebrate effort, curiosity and persistence.
 Praise process: "You tried different ways—that's great!" This builds resilience and willingness to take on challenging tasks.

Hence, How the school will support families (and how parents can connect)

We are committed to creating a seamless partnership with families. This 2nd semester the school will:

- Offer short, practical parent workshops on "Al basics for families" and "How to ask powerful questions with your child." These will include demonstrations of safe, age-appropriate tools and how we use them in classrooms.
- Share simple guides that show how to turn everyday activities (shopping, cooking, travel) into learning experiences and curiosity prompts.
- Continue to use formative assessments and provide clear, constructive feedback designed to support growth rather than only give grades.
 We will communicate what skills we're assessing and how you can reinforce them at home.
- 4. Strengthen two-way communication practices — quick surveys, virtual drop-ins, and culturallyresponsive family outreach — so our strategies are inclusive and realistic for our community.

Using technology and AI wisely — simple rules to be implemented both at home and school

Technology can accelerate learning when used intentionally. We will follow clear guardrails and ask families to join us in these practices:

- Purpose before tool, Always ask: what learning goal does this serve? Choose tools that support that aim.
- Teach students to verify. Encourage crosschecking AI outputs and sources; discuss bias and limitations.
- Limit passive screen time; increase productive use. Active creation (writing, coding, designing) beats passive consumption.
- Protect privacy. Help children understand personal data and ensure apps meet safety and age-appropriate standards.

A final note — learning as a shared adventure

When school and home work as partners, learning becomes a shared adventure: a child whose questions are noticed, whose mistakes are celebrated as steps, and whose use of new tools is guided thoughtfully will thrive. Over the coming months, we will keep the parents and gurdians informed of practical workshops, short guides and simple classroom routines you can bring into your home.

Thank you for your continued partnership, trust and energy. Together we can make Session 2025-26 a year when our children not only learn facts, but learn how to wonder, investigate and use powerful tools responsibly.

The event witnessed spirited participation from 185 players representing 9 different schools, with the championship expertly managed by a dedicated team of 18 jury members, referees, and technical staff.

The competition commenced at 8: 00 a.m. with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp, paying homage to the departed souls, the founders of the school, and the Almighty. This solemn ritual was performed by the Head of Sports Department, Mr. Purnendu Ghosh. The championship was graced by the esteemed presence of Mr. Hemant Dangi, Central Member of the Nepal Taekwondo Association, as the Chief Guest, whose presence added dignity and vibrancy to the dynamic sporting atmosphere of DAV School. The winners were honoured by the Chief Guest in the presence of Viceprincipal Mr. Ramchandra Khanal and Mr. Ghosh.



In the overall results, Shree Bishnudevi Secondary School secured the championship title with an impressive haul of 14 gold, 3 silver, and 4 bronze medals. DAV School claimed the second position with 8 gold, 9 silver, and 37 bronze medals. GEMS and Jugal Nawa Gurukul shared third place. GEMS won 6 gold, 2 silver, and 7 bronze and Jugal Nawa Gurukul won 4 gold, 12 silver and 2 Bronze. Notable individual accolades included Barshika Mahara of Shree Bishnudevi Secondary School, who was named the Best Female Poomsae Player in the Under-12 Individual category: Garima Pun of DAV School, awarded Best Female Kyorugi Player in the Under-23 kg

category; Navyam Lama of Bodhi Briksha Secondary School, crowned Best Male Poomsae Player in the Under-10 category; and Aayam Paneru of GEMS, who earned Best Male Kyorugi Player in the Under-72 kg category. Akshunna Rai of DAV School was recognised as the Emerging Player of the Championship.

A wide range of participating schools achieved commendable results in various individual categories across both Poomsae and Kyorugi events. The championship featured competitions in multiple age groups, separately for boys and girls, showcasing the talent and determination of young taekwondo enthusiasts.

It gives us immense pride and pleasure to share that the educational model DAV has been advancing for the past 33 years has now become widely recognised, both at home and abroad. Our unwavering commitment to Sanskrit and Vedic education, activity-based learning, culture-integrated teaching, ICT and Anglo education, along with comprehensive skill development, has been meaningfully reflected in our theme-based academic year.

The theme for the academic session 2025–26 is "EACH" – Empowering Each Student's Academic Excellence, Cultural Sensitivity, and Holistic Well-being. This transformative initiative is a visionary step under the leadership of scrupulous Principal, Dr. Bhubaneswari Rao.

During the second semester, Chairperson Shree Anil Kedia addressed the students, teachers, and parents on several occasions, highlighting the vision behind DAV School's establishment by his father, Late Shree Shankar Lal Kedia. His vision was to provide an education embedded in Eastern values and Vedic wisdom while embracing the scientific and technological advancements of Western education. This philosophy, pioneered by Dayananda Saraswati as the Dayananda Anglo-Vedic (DAV) model, has today permeated into a network of nearly 900 DAV Schools and 75 universities/colleges worldwide. DAV Kathmandu is proud to be a part of this vast and prestigious network.

The academic session 2025–26 commenced with Vidya Subharambha Havan, symbolising DAV's strong foundation in Vedic traditions. In the academic sphere, the school attained remarkable results in both SEE and CBSE examinations. Out of 227 students in SEE Board, four secured a perfect 4 GPA, and 110 students achieved an A+. Similarly, in CBSE Grade XII, 10 Science stream students and 7 Commerce stream students scored above 90%, while in CBSE Grade X, 23 students out of 109 achieved the same milestone. Consequently, both Grade X and XII achieved 100% results.

Beyond the academics, DAV School celebrated global days such as World Earth Day, World Environment Day, World Population Day, International Friendship Day, International Yoga Day, and World Music Day to name a few for citation. These programmes, involving all students in creative activities and competitions, aimed to instill awareness and responsibility towards the global community.

Equally vibrant were the celebrations of cultural events and festivals according to the Hindu calendar. Programmes such as Teej, Krishna Janmastami, Janai Purnima, Matatirtha Aunshi, Buddha Purnima, Shrawan Somwar, Kushe Aunshi, and Gaijatra reinforced DAV's belief in keeping culture alive for future generations. Out of total 138 students appearing in the Board examination from Grade XII, 10 students from Science stream and 7 students from Commerce stream have achieved 90% above results.



His teachings included the Five Great Renunciations (Pancha Maha Parityag), the various types of Buddhas—Shravaka Buddha, Sambodhi Buddha, and Brahmachitta Buddha—as well as concepts such as Bodhi Gyan, the Four Noble Truths (Chatur Arya Satya), and the Five Precepts (Panchasheel Marg).

He poignantly noted that the true success of the 2569th Buddha Purnima would be realised only when each of us offers to others the same kindness, speech, and behaviour we wish to receive—and refrain from giving what we ourselves would find unpleasant.

Bhikshu Bimalo also highlighted the extraordinary potential of human life, explaining that by living with mindfulness and compassion, one may achieve a state of honour even greater than that of the gods. Dr. Bhubaneswari Rao, the Principal, formally announced the Secondary Education Examination (SEE) results for the academic session 2024/25 during a special assembly on 30th June 2025. The results were published earlier on the official website of the National Examination Board on 27th June, 2025.

The SEE batch of 2024/25 brought immense pride to the DAVSKVB community by surpassing all previous records in school's history. Out of 227 students who appeared from DAV, four students—Apekshya Shah, Nuwan Kulung Rai, Sankalpa Mani Devkota and Soyana Khadka—secured a perfect 4.0 GPA, topping the school. Hegirean Thapa and Saksham Ojha followed closely with a GPA of 3.96, securing the second position. Seven students shared the third position with a GPA of 3.95. They are Aakriti Jha, Aditi Mishra, Dikshit Babu Acharya, Jenisha Bajracharya, Omraj Jha, Saurya Jha, and Widushee Bhatta.

The overall performance was remarkable, with 106 students achieving a GPA between 3.61 and 3.96. Presenting a detailed GPA analysis, the Principal shared that 110 students earned an A+ Grade (GPA 3.61–4.0), 89 students achieved an A Grade (GPA 3.21–3.60), and 28 students received a B+ Grade (GPA 2.85–3.20).

To honour the occasion, the school invited the SEE batch of 2024/25 to the campus. The Principal extended a warm welcome to the toppers and all the graduates, congratulating them for their exemplary achievements. She also took the opportunity to express heartfelt appreciation to Mr. Narayan Khatiwada (Grade IX and X SEE In-charge), Mr. Tank Meghji Devji (Senior School Co-ordinator), Mr. Ramchandra Khanal (Vice-principal), and the entire team of dedicated teachers of Grade X. In a special announcement, the Principal declared that all students who scored a 4.0 GPA will be granted scholarships on tuition fees in Grade XI (CBSE) for the academic year 2025/26. Among the beneficiaries is Shambhavi Gurubacharya of Grade XI 'C' (CBSE), who achieved a 4.0 GPA while studying at GEMS.

During the assembly, the Principal offered a platform for Grade XI CBSE students— who had previously appeared in the SEE Board—to share their results with the school community. It was truly inspiring to witness top-performing students from various regions of Nepal choosing DAV CBSE as their academic destination.

To commemorate this historic achievement, the Principal announced a celebratory holiday for all students from Kindergarten to Grade XII on 1st July 2025.
